

Millersport Lions

Club fun facts

1946-1947 Charter Pres. E. H. "Doc" Fahl submitted

The very first president of the Millersport Lions Club was Elwood "Doc" Fahl, owner of the Millersport Rexall Pharmacy, which today is the site of Hometown Hotdog, owned by Lion Kim Oxley.

During the time period that the Sweet Corn Festival was held on the streets of Millersport, the back room of the pharmacy served as the Festival Office.

From 1946 until 1958, the Lions Club held their club meetings in the old Millersport Methodist Church that was demolished in 2021 to make room for the new Millersport Coffee building.

From 1958 - 1968, club meetings were held in the former Millersport Fire Department building on Lancaster Street.

Past President Clyde Haught, father of Past President Dina Keller and grandfather of Lion Jessica Slater, designed and supervised the construction of the new Lions Clubhouse in 1968. It immediately became the center of activity for the community and a new stage was built outside the south doors and occupied the site until 1988 when the Brookover-Harlow Pavilion was erected. Demolition of the old stage allowed for the Powers Addition to the Lions Clubhouse in 1992.

Now you know where the Millersport Lions Club has gathered and functioned for the past 75 years!





Come walk/run with your best friend to end canine cancer & sarcoma

Dear Hank,

I wanted to do some fun things this summer with my kids and my dogs and I was wondering what you would suggest. There aren't a lot of places that I can do fun things with both my kids and my fur babies. I want to include my dog because he is part of our family and he loves to go fun places with us too!

Kid and Dog Mom,

That's a great question! You could bring your kids and dogs to my annual race this summer on Saturday, July 9th at the Fairfield County Fairgrounds. The money raised at the event will help the Hank Kabel Sarcoma Foundation continue their mission of raising money and awareness for canine cancer and sarcoma.

Canine cancer and sarcoma are diseases the Hank Kabel Sarcoma Foundation is trying to bring awareness to and raise money for. According to the Veterinary Diagnostics Institute (2012) cancer is the leading non accidental cause of death in dogs, with 1 in 3 dogs being diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime and 50% dying from the disease.

According to the Sarcoma Alliance (an organization that provides guidance, education, and

support to those affected by sarcoma) sarcoma is a rare cancer of the connective tissue. Connective tissue includes soft tissue and bone. Sarcoma can occur in any location. Although sarcoma represents only about 1 percent of adult cancers, it represents approximately 15 percent of pediatric cancers. The Sarcoma Alliance website (2015) cites Stephen Withrow, professor of surgical oncology at Colorado State University and the founding director of the Flint Animal Cancer Center, who shares that sarcoma is five times more common in dogs than humans (with children being the 2nd most common to dogs to get sarcoma). The website shares that by treating dogs with cancer, veterinarians gain important insights into improving treatments for humans.

At the 2022 Hank Kabel Sarcoma 5K Walk/Run participants will be able to walk/run a 5K and the first 100 runners to sign up will receive a bag of goodies. Runners who sign up early will receive a \$5 discount. Participants will get to purchase raffle baskets and interact with various vendors like Fido, Hair of the Dog, Paparazzi Jewelry, Bon's Creations, the Fairfield County Sheriff's Office and the Lancaster Police Department, along with many others. There will also be informational speakers such as FireDog Oakley, bed bug dog Hank the Tank, and Search and Rescue K9 Sasha, along with other speakers who will share the wonderful things dogs do to improve our lives.

The schedule for the 2022 Hank Kabel Sarcoma 5K Walk/Run and Fest includes:

7:30-8:30 Registration 8:30 Opening Ceremony 9:00 Race 10:00-10:30 Awards 10:30-1:00 Speakers Kick off for the race will begin at Hank's bench on the Rising Park side of the fairgrounds. That's where the 2023 "Around Town With Dogs" calendar will be unveiled and available for purchase for \$15. This calendar will showcase local businesses who do things for dogs. 
