



Sewer: Two weeks ago with the high rains Stutske Construction used their vacuum truck and cleaned out the lift station at the plant. Because of the debris that flows to the sewer plant we need to vacuum the system every three months as part of a preventative program. We are also going to repair a section of sewer line from the Old Canal restaurant to

Hometown Hotdog.

Street: Our solicitor is working on the Cincinnati Insurance lien and the role of ADR, DuraSeal and Kokosing Materials. It was learned that DuraSeal has been reorganized and may no longer be in business.

Police Department: Chief Mark Consolo sent statistics for the month of May. The department issued (22) twenty-two traffic warnings, (3) three traffic citations in, (12) twelve dispatch runs and (5) five mutual aid runs. Regular officers worked (272.25) two hundred seventy-two and onequarter hours.

Fire Department: Chief Robert Price sent the run totals. For the month of May Station 631 made forty-seven (47) runs; Station 632 made twenty-three (23) runs; Station 633 made twenty-five (25) runs; and Walnut Township made twenty-nine (29) mutual aid runs.

Water: CT Consultants recommended that council award Consultants the meter bid to NECO Water and the tower bid to D&M Painting. Council authorized CT Consulting to apply for low interest loans for the village. Council passed Resolutions 1362 and 1362 approving contracts for meters and the painting and restorations. Both projects are to be started this summer and to be completed by the end of 2022.

The Ohio Water Development Authority granted 1.73% ten year loan to the village for the two projects. Also, we have a separate quote to clean the two wells that are not part of the OWDA projects.

John M. Hay, Lincoln, and Fairfield County- Part II

By Carolyn Tilley

We are following the connection of Lincoln's secretary, John Milton Hay and his family on Crumley Road, Fairfield County. When Adam and Mary Hoeh, Hay, came to Ohio, they petitioned for the quarter of land at the end of Crumley. But Adam died in 1803 and left a will, the first probated in Fairfield County, which stated his wife and son-in-law Luke Ingram to be his executors. His named two sons, Jonathan and Peter, who were to have some farm animals after their mother died, but money was to be for land. At the time of his death most settlers had not been able to pay for their selected land at the land office in Chillicothe. So our records first show Mary owning the quarter of 160 acres in 1811. She died in 1815. There is no record of Adam and Mary's burial and being so early, we might assume they were buried on the property. Daughter Elizabeth Hay had married Luke Ingram, an early pioneer name here in our area, back in Virginia, and moved here with her parents it seems. Luke owned land in the east quarter, 60 acres next to the west quarter of his in-laws in 1813, but Elizabeth died in Ashland County where some more of the family had gone. Records show all the family signed the will as children and heirs, including son John in Kentucky, that we wrote about in Part I, the grandfather of our subject.

Oldest daughter Barbara married John Hartong in Virginia and after his death may have come here to marry again in 1819, but is buried in Indiana. John, the grandfather of our subject, was child two and Elizabeth Ingram number three. Catherine, child four, married Thomas Selby and died in Ashland Co. Eve Ann, no. 5, married in about 1802 to Jacob Leathers here but moved to Wayne County, Ohio and then Illinois where they had seven children.


Susanna Hay, no. 6 child, married Tunis Newkirk and settled in Greenfield Township with 5 children, several staying here. There are Newkirk burial records but not the parents; stones may be gone. We found one son buried in a small cemetery in the Rock Mill area.

Daughter Rosanna, no. 7, married Owen Abbott in 1824. Records show Owen ran the store at Rock Mill, had two distilleries; one on the farm of his brother-in-law Peter Hay, number nine child, where he married Rosanna. He was Justice of the Peace for 15 years probably in Madison

Township, where he ran a well-known store at Clearport. There many Abbotts are buried in Mt. Carmel Cemetery. Owen and Rosanna had two sons and three daughters. One son, Lafayette, was with Sherman's March to the Sea and lost an arm in the war. He lived until 1895. The family had come from Vermont; father Erastus died here in 1855 at age 89. Rosanna Hay Abbott aHay died in 1852 and Owen in 1862. The descendants continued to live in the Amanda area, and I knew many. One became my Aunt Florene when she married my Uncle Wallace Barr Sr.

Number 8 son was Jonathan Hay who married Elizabeth Hooker here but moved to Wisconsin. That brings us to son Peter, number 9, who stayed on our properties and is buried in Amanda Township Cemetery with his wife Christina Platter born in Ross County. They were married here in 1819 and had nine children. Family records say he had a mill on the property, which sold in 1830; surprising, as it is rather flat except for a ridge toward the west. So we wonder, what kind of mill? He was born in 1788 and died in 1852 and his wife in 1858. Buried with them are a baby Zelda, adult son Joseph, and adult daughter Catharine. Internet records show a Catherine marrying later, so we wonder about those records. Another daughter Margaret is also buried in Amanda Township Cemetery with her husband Col. David Schleich. Daughter Sarah Jane, "Jennie", married a Daniel Schleich who lived in Amanda, and the family records noted they are buried in the Amanda Presbyterian Cemetery, but there is no recorded record of them. Son Peter II is in the middle of the family with two more brothers Edward and Edwin, who are shown signing off on the properties. The youngest child of Peter is Leander Hay who married Melinda Strickler of Madison Township, daughter of Isaac Strickler. Both were land owners and farmers there. Well-educated Leander served as justice of the peace and township clerk. Their only son Frank married Rose Hanaway. The reason I mention these folks is to get back to the land transactions on our property, the two quarters at the end of Crumley Road from the curve in the woods to Rock Mill









