

John M. Hay , n Tilley



We are relating the connection of one of Abraham Lincoln's personal secretaries, John Milton Hay, to his ancestors that settled in Amanda Township at the end of Crumley Road. Son Peter I of Adam and Mary Hay, the first settlers, took over the quarter of his mother the same year she is registered and must have lived there his whole life. Any remnants of a homestead were never there in my lifetime. In 1857 his son Peter II, born circa 1834, took over, and his uncle Jonathan and his siblings sold their shares of the quarter to him. Peter then sold it to Lewis Kiger in 1869 and must have left the area. In the east quarter Joseph Hardesty, my ancestor of our near-by property, seems to have first owned it and sold the west side next to Peter I, to Peter's brother-in-law Luke Ingram and the east part to another family we will not get into. Peter I then bought this west part to connect his quarter of land in 1816, and we think the Ingrams left the area. Lewis Kiger began buying parts from Peter I and others in 1847. Lewis was from a big Kiger family whose parents are buried in Turkey Run whom we have written about. Lewis and

Township, Lewis (1813-1903). In the 1875 atlas of the county Kiger owned both quarters and the only evidence of homes are on the Route 188 side; I assume the Reese-Dunkle home and the former Hoffman home today. All other homes on the quarters are late 20th century homes of which there are many. Most of Mary Hay and her son Peter I's quarter, once farm land, is now recently cut into 17 properties. The middle of the two quarters is still farmland with more homes in the east end near the wooded curve on Crumley. Do you wonder if all those early folks realized they had a famous cousin?

John Milton Hay, as assistant secretary to President Lincoln, with John Nicolay, first shared a room in the White House and then Hotel. Willard's Their responsibilities included writing letters, reading and sorting mail, receiving and screening visitors, serving as messengers, preparing digests of news, and occasionally attending to political matters for the President. The older Nicolay was quite somber, while John Hay had a quick wit, was cheerful and convivial, cosmopolitan and debonair. His personality meshed easily with his more rustic boss, for whom he was almost a surrogate son. Hay's admiration for the President was almost boundless. As shown in the history drama, Lincoln came into John's bedroom to rouse him and discuss a letter he had written. This happened often in their relationship as well as sharing rides, dinner, and confidences. The secretaries were given ranks as military aides for their White House duties. Hay was present in the room when Lincoln died. Seward appointed Hay secretary to the legations in Paris (1865-67), Vienna (1857-68), and Madrid (1869-70). Returning to the U.S.,

his wife are buried in Amanda Hay became an editorial writer for the New York Tribune. In 1874, he married Clara Louise Stone, daughter of Amasa Stone, moving to Cleveland in 1875 and remaining until 1886, working for his father-in-law and serving on various civic and cultural boards. He was a local celebrity, but was bored with the local society and expressed his views in an anonymously authored The Bread Winner. He moved his family to Washington. In 1890, he and his old friend John Nicolay authored the 10-volume Abraham Lincoln: A History. Hay also edited a collection of Lincoln's writings. In 1896 Hay campaigned for Wm. McKinley, and in 1897 was rewarded with appointment as ambassador to Great Britain. He was appointed Secretary of State in 1898, by McKinley and then served under Roosevelt. Hay participated in events attendant upon the Spanish-American War, enunciated the "Open Door" policy concerning China, and under Theodore Roosevelt, aided treaty negotiations leading to the construction of the Panama Canal. Hay and his wife had four children, Alice Wadsworth, Helen Whitney, Clarence and Adelbert. His wife died before him and was buried in her hometown of Cleveland. John died in 1905 in their home in Newbury, N.H., and was also buried in Cleveland in Lake View Cemetery. There are many writings about his man, among them one published of John Hay's Civil War Diary which tells us so much about our great president through this turbulent time in history. I hope this might get you a bit interested in this man and his times. Again I wonder if his many far-flung cousins Secretary of State W.H. realized their relationship to someone who had such a front row seat to history.



Village Council met on Tuesday, July 12, 2022, at 7:00 PM in the Municipal Building. In attendance were Mayor Gary Matheny, Council Members Stephanie Helle, Craig Cooperrider, Elizabeth Butler, Rick Thompson and Councilor Dustin Bidwell. Also present were Fiscal Officer Susan A. Ramsey, Zoning Administrator Bill Simpson, Park and Recreation Director Tom Nebbergall and Village Administrator Vincent Popo. James McKittrick was absent. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was said. Roll call was taken and Councilor James McKittrick was absent.

**NEW BUSINESS:** The first performance of Music In The Park on Saturday June 25, 2022 featured David Spires. The July 16, 2022 event featuring Sweetwater was canceled due to weather and may be rescheduled on Saturday, August 20, 2022. Thursday October 27, 2022 is set for Trick or Treat and Monster Mash II featuring Roxey Jane.

<u>Sewer:</u> Stutske Construction repaired a section of sewer line from the Old Canal restaurant to Hometown Hotdog

Street: Our solicitor is working on the Cincinnati Insurance lien and the role of ADR, DuraSeal and Kokosing Materials. It was learned that DuraSeal has been reorganized and is no longer in business.

**Police Department:** Chief Mark Consolo sent statistics for the month of June. The department issued (8) eight traffic warnings, (2) two traffic citations in, (18) eighteen dispatch runs and (7) seven mutual aid runs. Regular officers worked (243.25) two hundred forty-three and onequarter hours.

**Fire Department**: Chief Robert Price sent the run totals for the month of June. Station 631 made forty (40) runs; Station 632 made twenty-five (25) runs; Station 633 made twenty-nine (29) runs; and Walnut Township made thirty-six (36) mutual aid runs.

Water: CT Consultants hosted a pre-construction meeting with NECO Water and D&M Painting. The projects are to begin by the end of summer. The Ohio Water Development Authority granted 1.73% ten year loan to the village for the two projects. Also, we have a separate quote to clean the two wells that are not part of the OWDA projects. Fiscal Officer Susan Ramsey sent the 2023 budget electronically to council for the second reading. The full budget will be ready for the July meeting. A Finance Committee Meeting has been set for Tuesday July 19, 2020 at 6 pm. Tom Nebbergall found a company from Florida that does brick engraving that cost approximately \$20 per brick without insignia and \$26 per brick with the branch of service. 

#### City of Lancaster and Lancaster City Schools work together on new use of former General Sherman Junior High

City Council recently approved the purchase of the former General Sherman Junior High building. Lancaster City School Board approved entering into negotiations for the sale of the property.

The approvals signify a unique collaboration that will benefit the community of Lancaster and its citizens for generations to come a win for all three entities involved: Lancaster Water Department, Lancaster City Schools and Lancaster Parks & Recreation.

The terms of the agreement will include payments of \$78,000 per year for five years (total \$390,000) to Lancaster City Schools. The City of Lancaster Water Department's budget will cover the first three years of payment, while the final two years will be paid by Lancaster Parks and Recreation, which operates under a separate budget and income structure outside of the City of Lancaster General Revenue Fund.

By working together with the City of Lancaster Water Department to negotiate a generous and yet responsible purchase agreement, as well as being flexible in the payment terms, Lancaster City Schools will not only be upcycling this former school location but will also be providing a new location for Parks headquarters and indoor recreation opportunities for the citizens of Lancaster, and in particular, the families of the near west side of the city.

Additionally, this initiative will alleviate the problematic cancellation of baseball and football games for youth and recreational leagues that occur every season in Miller Park by relocating the sports fields to this new location. This will ensure the field locations are more walkable for the local community and will also make way for new water facilities in the current Miller Park location, which is a much more strategic use of that property.

"This partnership between city leaders, the water department, the schools and the parks is an incredible demonstration of collaboration and good stewardship of taxpayer dollars,' said Carrie Woody, Immediate Past President, City of Lancaster

Directors. "On behalf of the Lancaster City Parks board and staff, I would like to express my profound gratitude to the board and administration of Lancaster City Schools and to the Lancaster

Lancaster, Ohio - Lancaster Parks and Recreation Board of City Water Department for their and recreation system - and partnership in securing the former General Sherman Junior High building for use by the Lancaster Parks and Recreation System."

"Our students and staff and their families utilize our city parks working together on behalf of the betterment of our community as a whole is critical to success for our District," said Nathan Hale, Superintendent, Lancaster City Schools. "We are so proud to work

## Dear Hank

Can you tell me more about sarcoma, comparative oncology and the One Health Initiative and what The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center is doing to fight cancer?



That's a great question!

#### Sarcoma

First of all, cancer begins when healthy cells change and grow out of control and become a tumor. According to the Sarcoma Alliance website (2022) sarcomas are cancers that develop from bones or soft tissues, such as fat, muscles, nerves, and more. Sarcomas are divided into two main groups: bone sarcomas and soft tissue sarcomas. Although rare, there are approximately 17,000 new cases of sarcoma diagnosed each year in the United States.

The Sarcoma Alliance shares that sarcomas account for 1% of all adult cancers and 15% of all childhood cancers. The National Canine Cancer Foundation (2022) adds that sarcomas account for about 15% of canine cancers.

#### **Comparative Oncology**

Cancer affects all mammals so doctors understand the importance of studying all creatures, including canines. According to the Duke Cancer Institute website (2022) comparative oncology is the study of naturally occurring cancer in animals and the comparison to its human counterpart for better understanding of cancer biology and to achieve treatments and cures that benefit both humans and animals.

#### **One Health Initiative**

The Duke Cancer Institute (2022) shares that this concept of One Health is gaining momentum and being re-discovered by the current medical and veterinary communities, however it dates back to the late 1800's. Rudolph Virchow (1821-1902) was one of the 19th century's foremost leaders in medicine, and he is considered the Father of Modern Pathology. He noted the link between diseases

of humans and animals and coined the term "zoonosis". He famously stated, "Between animal and human medicine, there is no dividing line-nor should there be. The object is different but the experience obtained constitutes the basis of all medicine."

#### The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center

According to the National Cancer Institute website (2022) The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center has a number of clinical partners including The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center and Nationwide Children's Hospital and it ranks as the third largest cancer hospital in the nation.

Researchers and clinicians at the OSUCCC-James realize there is no routine cancer because each patient's malignancy is biologically unique and must be with treated individualize therapies that target its molecular characteristics. The work of multidisciplinary teams of scientists contributes to the OSUCCC-James's mission of rapidly translating groundbreaking discoveries into innovative patient care via sponsorship of hundreds of clinical trials on the latest therapies-some of which are available nowhere else. The OSUCCC-James is one of only a few comprehensive centers funded by the NCI to conduct phase 1, phase 2, and phase 3 clinical trials of NCI-sponsored novel cancer drugs.

Dr. Raphael Polluck is the director of The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center. Dr. Polluck is a worldrenowned authority on sarcoma

and was recruited in 2013 from the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center. Dr. Polluck explains that Nationwide Children's Hospital doctors are all part of the team at The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center, as well as sarcoma veterinary medical doctors at The Ohio State University Veterinary Medical Center. Dr. Polluck shares "We have one of the best and largest multidisciplinary sarcoma programs in the world right here in Columbus...which is very exciting!"

Another exciting thing is that The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center recently was awarded a grant. Dr. Polluck explains "We were very fortunate to have a major grant submitted for the Department of Defense Translational Science Award program, which recently got funded for \$3.5 million dollars on behalf of research in sarcoma. I am so grateful!" This grant is so important since a lot of cases of sarcoma are resistant to surgery, chemotherapy and radiation. Therefore, there is a critical need for research and new therapeutic treatments which this grant has potential to provide!

Stay tuned for my upcoming show on "Around Towne with Amy" (airing on CLN, You Tube and Facebook) where Dr. Polluck and I will show you the labs at The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center and introduce you to the sarcoma team there. Dr. Polluck will also share about their new \$3.5 million dollar grant and the opportunity it will make in research and finding a cure!


#### Scholarship for College Music Students


