



Sweet Corn Festival kicks off 75th anniversary

It's not every day that one gets invited to a 75th anniversary party, but when that opportunity comes around, we whole-heartedly recommend circling that date and making plans to attend. That is exactly why the Millersport Lions Club is officially inviting "one and all" to join them on August 31 - September 3 in Millersport for the "Diamond Jubilee Sweet Corn Festival." Founded in 1946 as a one-day street festival, it has been held every year since except for 2020. The event has steadily grown

in size and attendance to become one of the Midwest's iconic family traditions that always falls the Wednesday through Saturday before Labor Day.

The Millersport Lions have invited back all of the past Sweet Corn Festival Queens for special commemorative activities which will kick off on Wednesday, August 31 with them serving as the Grand Marshals for the Grand Parade. Nothing would be more fitting than our past queens riding along the two-mile parade route seeing

former classmates, teachers, neighbors, friends and family showing their undying support of them after so many years.

"Since its founding, the Sweet Corn Festival has been volunteer driven and community focused. Its mission from day one has not changed after 75 years," said Ron Keller, Festival General Chairman. "Our priority is to annually host a fun-filled fundraising event that promotes Millersport and the Greater Buckeye Lake Area while raising needed funds for a variety of charitable causes for the Millersport Lions Club and its partnering non-profit organizations

that operate the numerous food and game concessions during the four-day event."

In 1946, the festival served a pick-up truck full of fresh corn-on-the-cob in a large butchering kettle after it was husked by hand. In 2021, the festival served over 100,000 buttered ears in a huge, gas-fired stainless-steel trough after the ears were husked by the famous 1948 General Machinery Dual-Lane Corn Husking Machine. "The cooking method has evolved over the years, but the quality and savory sweet taste remains the same," said Keller. "Visitors can see the kettle used in 1946 on display in the Spurgeon Store in Heritage Village and observe the antique corn husker churning out a multitude of ears in the Sweet Corn Booth."

Four big nights of entertainment will be featured at the Brookover-Harlow Pavilion. On

Wednesday night The Nostalgics Swing Band will blast the tunes of the 1930s and 1940s that would have been heard to the huge crowds gathered at the Buckeye Lake Amusement Park during its golden era. Nationally known artist with local roots, David Spiers will be jamming away on Thursday night. Country music star Matt Stell will deliver an action-packed performance on Friday night and the The Frontmen "Playing Keeps Tour" will be the grand finale on Saturday. All shows are FREE and start at 8:30 pm.

How Chautauqua Blvd. got its unique name

Have you ever wondered why the street that has hosted the Sweet Corn Festival for the past 75 years is named Chautauqua Boulevard? It is named after the Chautauqua Movement that started in Chautauqua, NY in the late 1800s and spread across the United States. You can read about it here:

Millersport hosted the Chautauqua Movement starting in 1909. It was formed as the "Buckeye Lake Chautauqua" at the grounds of the Summerland Beach Hotel which was saved and restored by the Ohio

District/United Pentecostal Church International. We know the property as the Apostolic Campgrounds of Ohio. From 1912 - 1914 the name was changed to the "Summerland Beach Assembly." In 1911 a steel open pavilion was erected by the Ashtabula Steel Company next to the hotel to handle the large crowds coming to see and hear the Chautauqua speakers. It is now the Tabernacle and centerpiece of the Campgrounds. Attendees came from miles around by way of the Toledo & Ohio Central Railroad and disembarked at their station in Millersport to travel by carriage to the hotel.

Denison University conducted their first summer school at the hotel starting in 1912. In 1918 the Buckeye Lake Park Company bought the property and owned it until 1926. The Del Fisher Boat Line provided transportation across the lake to the Buckeye Lake Amusement Park during this period; the same family that still owns Fisher's Marina on Lieb's Island. While the hotel served as the host site of the Chautauqua Movement, the owners of the grove of woods that now encompasses Historic Lions Park churned out homemade ice cream to attendees sitting on benches taking a break from the day's activities next door.

Long before the Ohio District/UPCI and the Millersport Lions Club bought their adjoining properties in the 1940s and 1950s, there was a history of cooperation between these neighbors. That is how Chautauqua Blvd. got its unique name!

The very first Sweet Corn Festival was held on the streets of Millersport near Chautauqua Blvd and Lancaster Street. We do have a photo of that moment.

The festival was a one-day event and it was billed as the Millersport Lions' "Festival & Auction." We actually have a poster saying that because I don't think our founders were sure about what the public wanted. The auction was a farm implement consignment auction held in an open area where the Millersport Hardware stands today. We have a photo of that too.

The corn was cooked in a butchering kettle that was donated by Doris Wyckoff the year she served as Grand Marshal. It is on display in the Spurgeon Store and it has a crack just like the Liberty Bell. The corn was hand-picked. One pick-up truck load was all they needed back then. The corn came from the old Shelly Farm on State Route 79 where the Light-house Church stands today.

50 years of outdoor drama

Nestled in the Sugarloaf Mountain is a magical site of 206 acres that has been providing entertainment, culture, vision and artistry to over 3 million visitors over the years. This year is the 50th year of this drama that began with a dream.

How It All Began

Rusty Mundell, a continuing education history professor at Ohio University, Chillicothe and his wife, Jean went to see the outdoor drama "Unto These Hills" in Cherokee, North Carolina. Intrigued by Ohio history and ended with a love of the arts, Mundell and his wife were captivated by the outdoor theater telling of the historical account. The immersive theatrical setting, as well as the success of drawing people to the region, sparked a dream in their heart.

After returning home to Ohio, Rusty met with central Ohio

friends and businessmen, Robert C. Evans, a Chillicothe Realtor, and Herbert Friedman, an accountant and owner of Globe Furniture, who likewise were convinced that this could be an educational and economic boom to the Chillicothe region. This move could showcase local history and the natural landscape of Chillicothe.

There was a passion that drove these men, and with determination and business connections in February 1971 the eastern hillside of Sugarloaf Mountain (in the Great Seal range) was acquired. Mundell began traveling to Columbus, Washington, D.C., Oklahoma, and Florida, to gain support of legislators and with the Shawnee Nation. Local community support was petitioned for financial support, and businesses and individuals became excited about something so unique coming to Chillicothe.

Constructing a theater for the drama literally took an army. The

216th Engineer Battalion of the 16th Engineer Brigade Ohio National Guard Corp of Engineers, cleared out the road to the amphitheater and began work on the eastern slope of Sugarloaf. Under the supervision of Chillicothe businessman and professional engineer Stuart Withers, the engineer trainees dozed, leveled, and graded the land. Withers and the Brigade donated their time to accomplish the construction. The Brigade gained training in exchange for the project which was valued at \$200,000.

In May of 1972, the construction contracts for a 1,600 seat theater were drawn and signed thanks to Ohio Congressman William H. Harsha, who had obtained a federal grant in February 1972. Finishing touches were made on the theater just hours before opening. When all was said and done, more than \$14 million dollars was invested in the Sugarloaf Mountain Amphitheater.

the show was struggling, and the end of Tecumseh was on the horizon. Everyone had resigned and money was dwindling. Founder and Board Member Emeritus, Robert Evans reached out to Marion Waggoner, who had written the drama "Simon Kenton" and was the producer and artistic director of "Legend of Daniel Boone". Waggoner knew that so much had been invested in the drama and he had to help. He took one year to save the show and even spent 6 months away from his Connecticut home to meet with the community and present the truth of their situation. Waggoner knew that without the support of the community the show would be over.

The community responded and state grants and private investors provided the organizers with the funds they needed to prevent the final act! This was the first time since 1972-1973 that the community rallied to help save the show that put them on the map. They still had to find that special person though who would bring the show back to life again.

A Revival

To bring the life back to the show, organizers recruited Brandon Smith, a native to Chillicothe. The young producer won the hearts of these headhunters right away. Brandon reignited the flame that had almost died out.

Since 2014, Smith has not only revived Tecumseh but also brought new experiences to the amphitheater such as "Mama Mia", "Haunted Mountain", "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow" and movie nights. Brandon has been increasing attendance with his new innovative and expanding ideas ever since.

If we have learned one thing, the drama Tecumseh teaches us to follow our dreams with hard work and persistence, and to not let challenges stand in the way of what we want.

Behind the Drama

Besides building the outdoor amphitheater, organizers had to prepare for the main act, the drama. They chose Allan Eckert to be the playwright. Eckert was a historian, novelist, seven-time Pulitzer Prize nominee and Emmy Award winner. He was also from Dayton, Ohio, and had already done extensive research into Tecumseh, so he was the best man for the job.

To narrate the drama, organizers chose Graham Greene. Greene is best known as inmate Arien Bitterbuck and his execution scene from "The Green Mile".

The Plight of a Production

All of the hard work had finally paid off and Tecumseh was a success for several years. In 2013,

Diamond Jubilee Memory

Hot, buttered, corn-on-the-cob is what has drawn faithful patrons to the Sweet Corn Festival for the past 75 years. The corn has been grown locally by several farmers over the years beginning with Harry Shelly on his farm on State Route 79 at Millersport Road in 1946. A few years later, Clarence Clark, fa-

ther of Patty Clark Zollinger, the very first Sweet Corn Festival Queen in 1948, grew our corn at his farm on State Route 79 at Canal Road. David Keller grew our corn for several years at his farm on Lake Road near Geiger Road and Irven Keller became our supplier for many years on his farm on Deep

Cut Road at State Route 37. Amazingly, all four of these gentlemen were active Millersport Lions. Today the corn is grown on irrigated fields near Urbana in Champaign County by Michael Farms and transported to Millersport by trucks.

The very first president of the Millersport Lions Club was Elwood "Doc" Fahl, owner of the Millersport Rexall Pharmacy, which today is the site of Hometown Hotdog, owned by Lion Kim Oxley.

During the time period that the Sweet Corn Festival was held on the streets of Millersport, the back room of the pharmacy served as the Festival Office.

From 1946 until 1958, the Lions Club held their club meetings in the old Millersport Methodist Church that was demolished in 2021 to make room for the new Millersport Coffee building.

From 1958 - 1968, club meetings were held in the former Millersport Fire Department building on Lancaster Street.

Past President Clyde Haught, father of Past President Dina Keller

and grandfather of Lion Jessica Slater, designed and supervised the construction of the new Lions Clubhouse in 1968. It immediately became the center of activity for the community and a new stage was built outside the south doors and occupied the site until 1988 when the Brookover-Harlow Pavilion was erected. Demolition of the old stage allowed for the Powers Addition to the Lions Clubhouse in 1992.

Now you know where the Millersport Lions Club has gathered and functioned for the past 75 years!

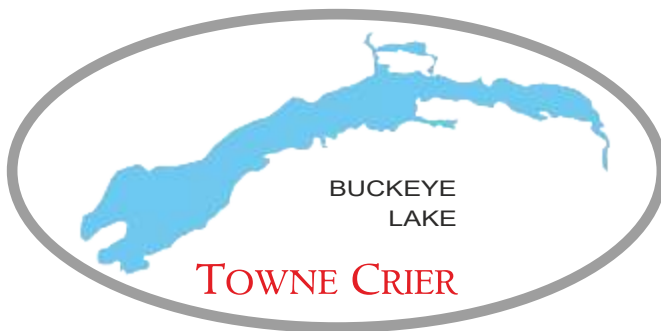

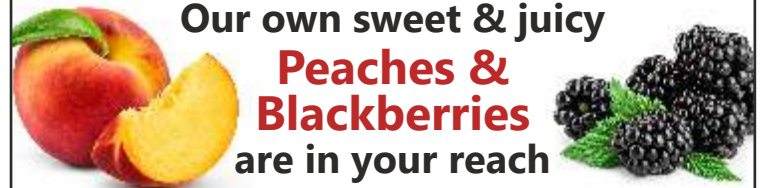

Starting in 1946, the immediate past president of the Lions Club served a one-year term as the General Chairman of the Sweet Corn Festival unless he declined to take the position. With the purchase of property in 1954 and the planned move to Founders Commons in 1958, the Lions Club voted to reorganize and incorporate by forming a 501 3 C nonprofit organization as the Millersport Lions Sweet Corn Festival, Inc. The articles of incorporation allowed for the General Chairman and Treasurer to be elected annually to serve at the pleasure of the Lions Board of Directors for unlimited duration. All assets of land, buildings, equipment and supplies were to be owned by the new corporation to allow for growth and flexibility for the future. Over a period of years multiple city lots, a shaded grove and farm fields that once belonged to the Mast, Hanna, Thomas and Dupler Families have been purchased to form present day Historic Lions Park.

When the Sweet Corn Festival relocated in 1958, Mayor Mac Chrisman and wife Katie, owned the house on the northeast corner of 7th Avenue and Chautauqua Blvd. The house is still there today directly across from the Gate #4 entrance. Mac Chrisman was a Past President of the Lions Club. Since the festival was now held on the city lots we know as Founders Commons and a section of Chautauqua Blvd, the Chrismans allowed the first floor of their home from 1958 to 1968 to be

used as dressing rooms for the stage performers and pageant contestants. When the new Lions Clubhouse was built in 1968, there was no longer a need for Mac and Katie to share their house to strangers.

Founders Commons was the first site of our midway when mechanical amusements became part of the festival in 1962. Our first ride supplier was Otterbacher Amusements.
